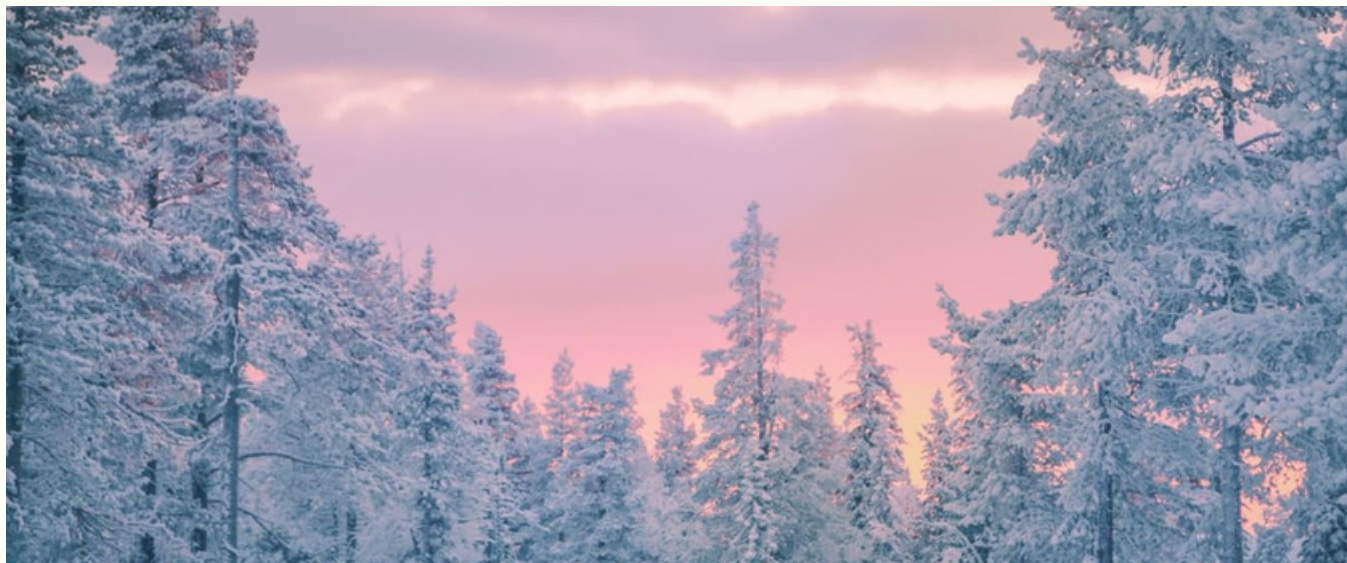

BOOKING PROCEDURES

Since the beginning of the pandemic, we have adopted a booking system for workstations in the RDC. Here are some important tips:

- Researchers are able to book a number of workstations all day. This can be done through the booking site, or you can email the Analysts at rdceuwo.ca to inquire about having one of us book this for you.
- Researchers should always aim to arrive to their booking within 20 minutes of it beginning. Please let us know if you are running behind, and if you are finishing early. Additionally, please let us know if you need to cancel an appointment.
- Bookings for the following week appear exactly 1 week prior.
